Revision to Bylaws of the Atlanta Chapter ATOS

The Bylaws of the Atlanta Chapter, ATOS, provide that changes to the bylaws can be made at the yearly business meeting, which will take place in December. Our present bylaws were composed and passed in 2005 with the expert advice of the esteemed Bob Foreman and have served us well for the past 17 years, but the advent of the recent health emergency has caused us to review them in order to make needed changes. Mr. Foreman advised me in 2005 that the bylaws should reflect what is actually being done, and not create a set of bureaucratic rules with which we struggle to comply. The proposed changes to the bylaws involved the mission of the chapter being broadened from "theatre pipe organ" to include electronic or digital instruments (which we are obviously already doing), to allow for meetings, especially board meetings, to be held by electronic means (such as Zoom) when necessary, and to adjust the guidelines for dues to more closely comply with how we are actually handling the membership roster. The proposed revisions have been reviewed and approved by Judge Hulsey.

I will present these changes in person at the December meeting and move that we accept a new version of the bylaws. Perhaps it will be another seventeen years before we need to revise them! Due to space limitations, we cannot publish the bylaws revisions word for word in the newsletter but if anyone wishes to see them prior to the December meeting, or has any questions, please email me at acatos@earthlink..net and I will send them to you and answer any questions.

AN AMAZING TRIP TO GORHAM'S BLUFF, ALABAMA



A scenic drive from Atlanta; a definite Fall chill in the air; and a Rockwell-canvas-like village greeted the 30 who came to listen to Jacksonville, Alabama's favorite musical son, Stuart Thompson at the Allen Organ. The Atlanta Chapter of ATOS enjoyed a most delightful Saturday road trip November 12th.

Stuart Thompson began piano lessons at age 8, and as a teenager visited Ron Carter's home when the Wurlitzer pipe organ was still in residence. And as we say in the theatre organ world, Stuart had his "WOW" moment. Largely self-taught on organ, Stuart obviously has a great ear and wonderful talent as he knows his way around the horseshoe-shaped stoprail, and for us he created a most eclectic, refreshing and enjoyable hour-long performance.

That chill in the air made *Winter Wonderland* an appropriate opener (despite Ken Double's joke that the Beatles' *Long and Winding Road* might also have been apropos). Next was one of two great old toe-tappers – *When That Midnight Choo-Choo Leaves for Alabam'* which was followed by the rhythmic Disney tune *Under the Sea* from the film *The Little Mermaid*. Stuart captured the almost rhumba-like rhythm to perfection, and also answered a request from our host, Debbie Chambless.

The first of two selections from the pen of composer/performer Billy Joel was one of his first hits dating to 1971 (gads, really?), She's Got a Way.

Then Stuart took us into the world of rock n' roll and used the Allen to perfection. Trems off, power reeds on, and a hit made famous not only by the band Journey, but as a theme for one of the *Rocky* films. Stuart's arrangement brilliantly captured the power and the beat of *Eye of the Tiger*. This selection was a great example of the flexibility of the theatre organ in the right performer's hands.

Inspired by a recording by organist Tom Helms, Mr. Thompson treated us to a beautiful rendition of *I'll Be Seeing You*. From ballad back to toe-tapping with *Paddlin' Madeleine Home* which was followed by some lovely music written by Fred Rogers, of *Mr. Rogers Neighborhood* television fame. Stuart informed us of Fred Rogers college studies in music, then played the famous theme from the Public TV show, *It's a Beautiful Day in the Neighborhood* followed by *It's You I Like*.

Charlie Brown TV specials inspired a medley of three Vince Guaraldi selections: *The Great Pump-kin Waltz; Thanksgiving Theme;* and *Christmas Time Is Here.* Another Billy Joel selection was next, a pretty song titled *Lullaby (Goodnight My Angel)*.

The Gospel favorite *I'll Fly Away* concluded a delightful program highlighted by so many refreshingly different themes. Thanks to Stuart Thompson, who made the trek to Gorham's Bluff several times for rehearsal. And thanks to newsletter editor Debbie Chambless, husband Daryl, and their friends from this delightful neck-of-the-woods overlooking the Tennessee River, for hosting us for the program. We also enjoyed seeing friends from the Alabama Chapter who came to support "one of their own." It was well worth the trip to experience this wonderful corner of the great state of Alabama.
