digital theatre organ. This is a variety show featuring over 50 performers just like the grand openings of the movie palaces of the 20's and 30's.

After the dessert and champagne

reception, take a tour of the theatre and then return to the auditorium for a theatre organ jam session by Atlanta Chapter's talented theatre organists! A ticket to the 8 pm show, the champagne toast and dessert reception, and the jam session is \$75.00 per person. ***Peachtree Road United Methodist Church
New Gallery Organ***

The new Gallery Organ at Peachtree Road United Methodist Church is now nearing completion.

It is unusual for a church to have more than one organ these days. However, in the past it was by no means so unusual for large churches to have two or even more organs in the one sanctuary. In France large churches often had a main organ, usually sited on a west gallery and a smaller instrument in the Choir. In Spain, South Germany and elsewhere, it was not unusual to have two identical looking instruments either side of the Choir and possibly a third one elsewhere. The purpose was to lead singing of congregation and choirs in the different parts of the building for different liturgies. Even today one occasionally finds a large organ on a gallery at the rear of the church with a smaller one in the sanctuary.



The liturgy of the Methodist Church is usually different from that of the historic buildings of Europe. All the activity takes place in the Chancel, rather than choirs being out of sight in distant galleries, so the main organ needs to be where the action is as well. Hence, the main organ is sited in the Chancel at PRUMC. So what purpose does a gallery organ serve here?

First, the new organ is of a different character than the main organ. It is based around the style of the French Romantic organ for which completely different organ literature exists, much of it very fine. But it also serves a liturgical purpose. Although both organs have mechanical action (where the link between the keys and the soundboards on which the pipes stand is mechanical) each can also be played from the other. This will ensure a more homogenous distribution of sound in the room which will enhance congregational singing. It will also offer exciting possibilities in concerts and recitals, an important outreach function in an active church.

The final stage, the so-called voicing is just about to commence and the plan is to have the new organ finished by Christmas.

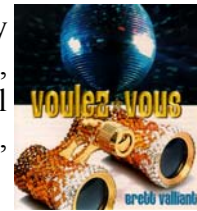
