with Ron Carter at the console of the 60-rank Aeolian Pipe Organ
Joint Fund Raiser for the Atlanta Chapter & Callanwold \$10 Advance \$13 Door
Please note the time: 6 pm so lighting conditions will be ideal***

This is a joint fundraiser for both the Callanwolde Fine Arts Center and AC, ATOS. Callanwolde was built in 1920 by the eldest son of Asa Candler, founder of Coca-Cola. This Gothic-Tudor mansion encompasses 27,000 square feet, centered around an enclosed courtyard, and is located in the historic Druid Hills area of Atlanta, an area planned by the firm of Frederick Law Olmstead. The estate also includes twelve acres of lush gardens, nature trails, a rock garden and the Conservatory headquarters for the DeKalb County Federation of Garden Clubs. The magnificent 3-manual, 752-pipe Aeolian organ, the largest of its kind in existence in a residence, will provide orchestral accompaniment to this 1929 avant-garde film starring the iconic Louise Brooks.

THE ORGAN... During the early 1900's, when symphony orchestras were virtually nonexistent, organ builders of the period crafted orchestral pipe organs to give audiences the opportunity to hear and enjoy the fullness of symphonic orchestral sounds. Wealthy families of the era often installed pipe organs in their homes. Most of these residential organs were manufactured by the Aeolian Pipe Organ Company, located in New York. The Great Depression brought an end to a lifestyle that could afford this kind of residential instrument and the Aeolian Pipe Organ Company declared bankruptcy. The massive Aeolian instrument, with 55 ranks of pipes, weighing 20,000 pounds was



installed while the walls were going up and "couldn't be extricated without wrecking the place" stated Charles Walker in a 1980's Atlanta Journal Constitution article about the mansion and organ. The three-manual console is located in the Great Hall and plays a "forest of pipes that reaches to the attic roof" with swell openings to the four chambers located throughout the house with the main sound coming into the Great Hall from a ceiling archway at the main front-door entrance and above the grand stair case. The instrument is controlled by a three-manual console with 147 tilting-tablet stop keys, a variety of push-button controls, and a built-in roll player. The Callanwolde Guild, a volunteer service organization of the Callanwolde Foundation, began to raise funds in 1975 for the organ's \$202,857 restoration. Major restoration of the organ began in June of 1985, when the Guild contracted with A. E. Schlueter of Lithonia, Georgia to begin restoration of the Swell Division. Total restoration was completed four contracts later in May 1993.

THE FILM... Produced at the end of the silent film era *Pandora's Box* stars Louise Brooks as Lulu, a young and raw seductress dashing through the lives of suitors who fall victim like a moth to her flame. The Germans were ahead of Hollywood at least 40 years by introducing the first lesbian character on film in Countess Anna, who is played by Alice Roberts. Louise Brooks appeared in 24 films between 1925 and 1938. She was a gifted actress, writer and dancer, having appeared in the Ziegfeld Follies. Nearly 70 years after her last films, Louise Brooks is remembered still for her independent spirit, remarkable beauty and trademark hair style. There is even a Louise Brooks Society, an internet-based international fan club that was begun in 1995, and has 1400 members from 49 countries. *Pandora's Box* is a German silent film directed by G. W. Pabst loosely based on a play entitled *Earth Spirit*. The film's title is a reference to Pandora of Greek mythology, who upon opening a box given to her by the gods released all evils into the world, leaving only hope behind. Louise Brooks stars as Lulu, a young and impulsive vaudeville performer whose raw sexuality and uninhibited nature bring about the downfall of almost everyone she meets including herself.

THE ARTIST... Ron Carter's first silent film accompaniment was at Callanwolde when he accompanied the classic film *Wings* in 1999. Since that time he has performed silent film accom-

paniment and theatre organ concerts all over the southeast at various venues including the Alabama Theatre in Birmingham, AL; Carolina Theatre in Greensboro, NC; Imperial Theatre and the Sacred Heart Cultural Center in Augusta, GA.; Strand Theatre in Marietta, GA; Church on the Square in The Villages, FL; Riviera Theatre in North Tonawanda NY; Athens Theatre in Deland FL; Tivoli Theatre in Chattanooga, TN; Tennessee Theatre in Knoxville, TN, Rylander Theatre in Americus, GA and at numerous churches and private homes. Interestingly, the Rylander Theatre screened this film with Ron at the Mighty Möller console because Louise Brooks had performed live on stage at the Rylander back in the 1920's. Ron retired from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation in 2005 after a stellar 38-year career in public law enforcement. He has served on the Board of the Atlanta Chapter of ATOS for over 25 years in various positions, including Chapter President, and currently is Secretary to the Strand Board of Trustees having served the Strand for 10 years and eventually becoming Chair of Operations and Facilities while a member of the Executive Team. Ron also was an organist and Director of Music at four churches in the last 45 years! With the help of Chapter members John Tanner and James Thrower, Ron and his lovely wife Donna

installed a 16-rank Wurlitzer Theatre Organ in their home in the early 1980s. Subsequently, this instrument was sold and Ron, having become the theatre organ consultant for Allen Organ Studios of Atlanta, purchased and installed a George Wright four-manual theatre organ in his Marietta lake home in 2003. Ron and Donna have been involved with the Atlanta Chapter for over 30 years and have opened their home for Chapter concerts many times. Their family consists of one son, John Carter, an investigator with the Cobb County District Attorney's Office, daughter-in-law, Julie, a teacher for Cobb County Schools, and their precious grandchildren Abby and Jake. This will be the fourth time Ron has accompanied *Pandora's Box* and his musical score performed on the Callanwolde Grand Organ will draw you into the film like no "talkie" could ever do!!

"In It for the Love"



With lighted drawknobs prominently displaying the marquee "ATOS", members of the Atlanta Chapter and guests knew they were in for a definite treat as they gathered in the Chapel – Chapel Music Company in Lithonia, to be exact. The inclement weather was no

deterrent, as attendees, with umbrellas firmly in hand, filled the demonstration room to capacity for the afternoon of Sunday, February 19th. The featured instrument was a 3-manual Rodgers Trillium 960, which the talented Rick McGee was able to coax into believing it possessed a Tibia or two.

On the heels of Valentine's week, the theme of love prevailed as Rick opened with *If This Isn't Love* in which he revealed the "hidden" theatre organ within. The tremolo carried on into the next selection – a familiar tune from the Crawford discography – *I'm Confessin'*. Rick then paid tribute to Atlanta's own Bob Van Camp with a beautiful performance of *Shangri-La* in the classic "Van Camp Style" which he does so well. Giving the tremolo a rest, Rick then

showed that both he and the organ were up to the task of more traditional "chapel music" with Stainer's *God So Loved the World*.

The songs of love continued in a Roberta Flack medley of *Making Love* and *I'm the One* and then into a Star-Crossed medley which showcased *Tara's Theme*, *The Man That Got Away*, *Frankie and Johnny*, *Love Story*, *A Time for Us*, and *Samson and Delilah*. To help prevent the program from getting too "mushy", and with the requisite umbrellas at hand, Rick lightened the load with an entertaining treatise of tunes from Mary Poppins. Finally, a nod to Bach and Fox as he closed with *Now Thank We All Our God*.

McCall, Boska, & Keaton = Triumph for the AGO

On February 12, John McCall premiered the newly installed Allen 317 theatre organ in the Maguire Center for Lifelong Learning at the Westminster Oaks retirement community in Tallahassee, Florida. The organ was donated to the center by Atlanta chapter member Fred Boska and installed in the auditorium with the console placed on stage. The Maguire Center auditorium is a remarkably large and beautiful facility and features state of the art sound and projection equipment which was in use that evening.

The inaugural program was sponsored by the Tallahassee AGO and featured two Buster Keaton comedies, *The Playhouse* and *The Electric House* with a medley from Showboat presented between the two films. John used other period music to open and close the program.

The AGO reported that the attendance was triple what they had expected – there is perhaps a lesson here with respect to the attraction of silent films with organ accompaniment – and the program was presented to an enthusiastic audience in an auditorium with few seats vacant. Their response was the best indication of the success of the program.

With the promise that any person left in the shop would be given a glue pot, brush, and stack of pneumatics to leather, the afternoon excursion to the East side of Atlanta came to an end. The musical program was quite a broad spectrum of

song and sound, and both organ and organist rose to the occasion most capably. Our thanks to Rick McGee for an afternoon of true artistry, and a sincere thank you to Art Schlueter, John Tanner, and the staffs of Chapel Music Company and A. E. Schlueter Pipe Organ Company for their very warm welcome and generous hospitality!
