#### A First Time for Everything

The theatre organ world is one in which there are a lot of "first times" and most of you could name a few of your own. But we as a chapter experienced a "first time" on March 8 at Stephenson High School when, for the first time ever, we had the opportunity to present the Grande Page to a combined gathering of all the music teachers – elementary, middle school, high school - in DeKalb County. The school system had an educational day for music educators, and we were given the opportunity to open the program with a "special presentation." I gave a 15-second history of the organ, introduced Ken Double and he brought the console up to applause, cheers, gasps, and general amazement. Ken's 12-minute presentation was masterful, as he explained how the organ worked and demonstrated both the resources and how to use them. He also acknowledged Mr. Goins and Dr. Vada Coleman, recipients of our President's Award for their long support of the Page. We had a lot of educators coming up to talk afterwards. At lunch, Ken started playing and the teachers started drifting in from the Commons to hear, applaud, and shout "Encore." Some took the opportunity to see the chambers. I don't know what they were expecting to see, but it wasn't what they got. They seemed to particularly enjoy the hammers banging away at the Xylophone and the Chrysoglott, were amazed by the cymbals and the realistic sound of the Clarinet, and the Tuba in the low range. It was a very successful day and we will build on it to gather interest in the future.


